Blue Ridge Community College is offering a new for 2021 Registered Cybersecurity Apprenticeship Training program that is preparing people for cybersecurity employment. Based on our highly successful two-year GO Virginia Cybersecurity Program, we include exam preparation for CompTIA Security+, training in NIST 800-171 principles, and direct CMMC assessment Levels 1 and 3 job training using industry-recognized software platforms. This grant-funded program is currently offered in-person or fully online and provides interactive, synchronous instruction, cutting-edge online laboratory simulations, mentoring, a Security+ exam voucher, and job training. In addition, we have the resources to get trained employees or apprentices for your business (primarily working in the Shenandoah Valley) with little paperwork and cash grant incentives!

We also offer a wide variety of credit and non-credit courses at the College, including a computer coding boot camp, CompTIA Network+, and two-year degree programs in Cybersecurity, Cloud Computing, Secure Networking, and Info System Technology.

Most cyber graduates are US citizens who can successfully obtain clearance. Military veterans are encouraged to apply to our IT programs.

Employer incentives for new APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS

We have teamed up with a workforce intermediary who can assist you with the Virginia Department of Labor and Industry registered apprenticeship paperwork. In addition, eligible companies may receive financial incentives for establishing or growing a registered apprenticeship work program.

GRANT FUNDED PROGRAMSSteps to Success

General Information Technology (IT) education/training plus our time-proven Cybersecurity job preparation training featuring CompTIA Security+

This Blue Ridge Community College cybersecurity program has been approved by the Virginia State Apprenticeship Agency as the training necessary to be accepted as paid Cybersecurity Technician Apprentices by companies in Virginia. The approval process consists of two parts, General IT education and Security+ certification with apprenticeship job training.

Blue Ridge offers the excellent Google IT Support Professional Certificate program. The class is fully online and may be started any time. It is grantfunded with a fixed price of only \$159.



We are currently training a large cohort that will finish in July of 2021. The next in-person / Live Online course will begin on Tuesday evening, September 28, 2021, and runs for 12 weeks for a total of 70 hours of training.

Virginia residents may easily qualify for FastForward funding for our Cybersecurity Technician Apprenticeship Training with Security+ and job training. This grant pays two-thirds of students' tuition! Also, if people are in one of the income brackets listed below, they will be eligible for G3 grant funding, which will pay the final one-third cost of tuition, making their cost \$0!

In addition to Blue Ridge Community College, several local public and private colleges and training centers provide a range of certifications and college degrees from Associates to Master's level in IT, cybersecurity, coding, and cloud computing.

The valley is only a 90-minute drive to Northern Virginia and is served by an airport that provides daily commercial jet flights to and from Dulles and Chicago. There is also daily train service to and from Alexandria and DC out of nearby Charlottesville, and twice weekly service in Staunton.
